ACCESSIBILITY AT THE HOUSE OF ST BARNABAS

Unfortunately, as a Grade I listed building, we have limited disabled access. The building's eighteenth century and Victorian features include a lot of steps, narrow doorways and narrow, steep staircases.

We are able to install a ramp from street level to the front door permitting guests in wheelchairs access to the majority of the ground floor. However, we do not have any facility to allow wheelchair access to the upper floors. There are currently no disabled WC facilities. If you require the ramp on your visit to the House, please call in advance to let us know the date so that we can ensure this is out and ready for you.

Assistance dogs are welcome in the House. Please call ahead to let us know you are coming.

WHY WE HAVE LIMITED ACCESS/OUR PLAN TO IMPROVE

As a charity we are very keen to be accessible to all and we have in place a plan to build a lift and disabled WC's. We are in the initial stages of a Heritage Lottery Funding bid for this, but it is unfortunately still some years off. We are planning this summer to install a partially accessible WC (disabled WC sized and fitted but with a corridor width restriction leading to it of 700mm).

In the meantime, we are always keen to learn more about facilities we might put in place to assist disabled visitors, so if you know of something we could and should be doing, please let us know.
